Initial activation

Getting started

Turn on the car ignition. Turn on your cell phone.

Pairing

On the car kit: Rotate the black knob to **SETTINGS**, push for menu, select **ADVANCED SETTINGS**, select **PAIR WITH PHONE**, select **OTHER PHONES**. "PAIR YOUR PHONE" will be displayed.

On your phone, find your *Bluetooth* options from your phone menu.

Select **SETTINGS** (or **TOOLS**); Select **CONNECTIVITY** then **BLUETOOTH**.

Select **SEARCH/ADD** a new *Bluetooth* (Hands-free) **DEVICE** (menu options will vary).

When the searching function is complete, select the PS7100.

Your phone will ask you for a PIN code; Enter 1234.

You can now phone a friend! To make a call, dial a number on your phone.

You will hear your friend's voice over your car speakers.

To end the call, press the red button on the car kit or your phone.

NOTE: Once the car kit is paired with your cell phone, it will automatically connect to your phone each time you start your car.

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How to use the dash-mounted control



1 Display

- Shows the network and battery level of your phone.
- Shows all the menus – PHONEBOOK, CALLS, DIAL, VOICE COMMANDS, SETTINGS.

2 Green Button

- Press to make a call, or answer an incoming call.
- During a call, press to put one call on hold and answer a second incoming call.

- To switch a call to private mode, press the green button during conversation; to switch back to hands-free mode, press the green button during conversation.
- Hold for 2 seconds to dial the last number called.
- Press this button to activate voice recognition.

3 Rotating Knob

- Rotate this knob button to navigate through the menus.
- Push this knob button to select an option.
- Rotate to change volume during a call.

4 Red Button

- While browsing in the menus, press to exit the menus.
- Press to hang up or reject a call.

How to delete pairing

Because only 5 different cell phones can be paired to the PS7100 car kit, you may need to delete older pairings. To do so, go to **SETTINGS, PAIRED DEVICES**, and select the cell phone and **DELETE**. Press the green button to confirm.

Placing a call using voice recognition

First, your cell phone must be paired and connected to the PS7100.

Recording the voice tag

- It is important to first record the car kit keywords: “Phone”, “Hang up”, “Home”, “Work”, “Cellular”, “General”, “Other”, “Preferred” through **VOICE COMMANDS, KEYWORDS**.
- Set the microphone volume to 75% because too low a volume level may cause the voice tag to activate too easily.
- You must have contacts in the **PHONEBOOK** menu of the car kit. Example: scroll to **VOICE COMMANDS, PHONEBOOK**, select “John Smith” and follow the instructions displayed on the car kit – The voice tag must be recorded twice.

Placing the call

- To call a contact that you have associated with a voice tag say “Phone” (or press the green button), you will hear a “bip”, say “John Smith” and the car kit will initiate a call for the associated contact phone number.
- To call a contact which has more than one phone number associated, say “Phone” (or press the green button), you will hear a first “bip”, say “John Smith”, you will hear a second “bip”, say “Cellular” and the car kit will initiate a call for that associated contact phone number. If you wish to call John Smith at home, you will have to say “Home” instead of “Cellular”.
